What makes Windermere Early Learning Kindergarten different?

Windermere ELC Kindergarten program is based in a nurturing long day care environment, providing a smooth comfortable transition into kindergarten for your child in surroundings where they already feel comfortable and happy.

This enables you and your child to enjoy the benefits of the long day care program.

You child will benefit from our evidence based best practice approach. We use a learning through play philosophy to nurture children's interests and foster their literacy and language development. This includes a number of daily 'adult-child' interactions in all activities.

Our partnership with Monash University on the Conceptual PlayWorld teaches Science, Technology and Engineering concepts. The focus is on creating "play worlds" where children learn by doing and experiencing.

There is no better way to prepare you child for the transition to school and beyond.





What we do

We use proven techniques of:

- Conversational Reading 'back and forth' conversations between adult and child. It is 'child-led' and responds to spontaneous interactions from the children.
- Learning Games teachers intentionally plan learning games based on the identified needs of each child, their abilities and interests.
 The activities are based on 1:1 or 1:2 adult-child interactions. These games are held as part of the children's intentional learning program.
- Enriched Caregiving every moment of every day is an opportunity to use reciprocal language with all children. This is implemented through incorporating conversation, ideas and song into everyday activities and routines.

What I did at kinder today...

Play is the most important aspect of a pre-school child's life and has enormous educational value. By actively playing, a child learns about the world around them. Play for children can be compared to work in an adult's life.

Through play children learn the basic skills that are necessary for lifelong learning. At Windermere ELC Kindergarten we know a play based program is essential. Children need the freedom to have a choice and voice in their learning environments.

Our play based kindergarten program sessions are busy and happy experiences.

Children who are already enrolled at Windermere ELC and are the required age to participate in the kindergarten program, will be offered the opportunity to meet with the teachers before they start in the program. This ensures transition is comfortable and smooth, and helps your child (and you) to become familiar with a new routine and ask questions.

We work with the children to develop all activities by planning their learning with them. Our program is developed based on children's individual skills and interests and is appropriate for their age group and stage of development. "What is desired is that the teacher ceased being a lecturer, satisfied with transmitting ready-made solutions. His role should rather be that of a mentor stimulating initiative and research." Getting ready for kinder

Starting kindergarten is a major milestone, and as with any new experience in life it takes time for children to feel relaxed and confident in a new environment. Rest assured, Windermere ELC teachers and educators are very supportive and experienced in quickly helping your child to feel welcome, comfortable and safe.



Your role as a parent...

You are your child's learning role model. All parents are invited to be involved in their child's learning by assisting in the classroom at least once a term where possible.

Parent helpers offer a huge resource and support base for our kindergarten community. Your involvement will show your children the importance of participating in the larger community. Not only will we benefit from your participation, but you will too!

Interacting with your child's teachers on a regular basis, will give you first-hand understanding of your child's learning.

Talk to your child about where they are going, what they will do, with who and why.

Our educators work to ensure that arrivals and departures to and from the centre are not only safe and secure for the children, but also a valuable means of exchanging 8 information with families.



How do I know if my child is ready for kindergarten?

Kindergarten readiness is at the top of many parents' minds. While a child's birthdate is one indicator, there are many other factors to consider and some things to have a think about include:


- Do they enjoy playing alongside other children?
- Do they feel comfortable separating from you?
- Are they able and comfortable communicating their feelings with their peers and teachers?
- Are they able and confident in talking about what they need?
- Are they aware of their bodily needs eg. ask for food if hungry, wash their own hands, go to the toilet?
- Are they able to understand and follow instructions to keep them safe?

If you believe your child doesn't meet some of these factors, that's ok. Come in and chat with the team to discuss options to prepare for your child's kindergarten experience, or give us a call on 03 9784 5300

National Quality Framework

The curriculum at Windermere ELC is based on the Victorian Early Years Learning and Development Framework (VEYLDF). The framework sets standards to deliver quality education for young children incorporating five interconnected Learning and Development Outcomes.

- Children have a strong sense of identity (identity)
- Children are connected with and contribute to their world (community)
- Children have a strong sense of wellbeing (wellbeing)
- Children are confident and involved learners (learning)
- Children are effective communicators (communication)

Our educators are committed to excellence in every aspect of their work and continually improve their teaching practice for your child.

What is the Child Care Subsidy?

The Child Care Subsidy (CCS) is the government's way of helping families with their child care fees. The government pays the CCS to us and we pass it on to you as a fee reduction.

The amount of CCS you receive is calculated by the Government and is based on:

- The type of childcare service you access (must be an approved childcare provider)
- Your combined family income
- An activity test.

Criteria for the activity test includes the length of activity you undertake and the different types of activity you do such as study, paid or unpaid work.

Eligible families may also be able to claim additional support through the Child Care Safety Net.

To receive CCS you need to register through the Australian Government's MyGov website, access the Centrelink portal, and provide an estimate of your work activity and income.
